*Asian Breast Care (ABC) for Asian American Women*

The Center for Pan Asian Community Services, Inc. (CPACS) aims to reduce the burden of breast cancer among uninsured and underinsured Asian and Pacific Islander (API) women by preventing cancer, saving lives, and diminishing suffering through culturally and linguistically appropriate health education and support for clinical preventive services including transportation, outreach, translation services during medical screenings and physician counseling, and follow-up referrals.

***Breast Diagnostic Services of Uninsured Women***

GCCE provides breast diagnostic services at no cost to high-risk, indigent/uninsured women of Fulton and Dekalb Counties.

***Breast Biopsy Services of Uninsured Women***

The Georgia Cancer Center for Excellence (GCCE) serves a primarily African American, indigent and un/underinsured population. Patients at GCCE experience multiple barriers to care that place them at risk for late stage diagnosis of breast cancer. To improve early detection rates of breast cancer in this population, breast biopsies will be provided at no cost to high-risk, indigent and un/underinsured women of Fulton and Dekalb counties.

***Impacting Treatment Completion through Navigation***

In an effort to improve treatment adherence, GCCE provides intensive professional navigation services to women requiring further diagnostic services and those diagnosed with breast cancer requiring treatment planning. These services include, but are not limited to: coordinating appointments for direct support or counseling, coordination of appointments and identification of financial resources.
