

JULY GRANTEE SPOTLIGHTS

“More than \$1.5 million has been awarded to the **West End Medical Centers** and the Medical College of Georgia Research Institute to help uninsured children in the state. The grant will be used to find and enroll eligible children in the Medicaid or the Children’s Health Insurance Program, or PeachCare for Kids as it’s known in Georgia. More than \$571,000 will go to the West End Center and nearly \$987,000 will go to the Medical College of Georgia.”

The 20th Anniversary Komen Atlanta Race for the Cure® in May marked a third return “home” for CPACS’s Korean CARE (Cancer Alliance and Resources for Empowerment) group. Korean CARE is the first cancer support group in an Asian language for sub-ethnic Asian American groups in Atlanta. CARE aims to reduce the burden of Asian American women diagnosed with breast cancer with culturally- and linguistically-appropriate support. The solidarity at Race for the Cure allowed CARE women to celebrate their accomplishments, sisterhood, and for new members to see that they do not need to be alone in their journey anymore.
