TurningPoint Women's Healthcare is pleased to announce that last month a significant milestone was met. TurningPoint provided rehabilitation services to the 1,000th new breast cancer patient since inception nearly six years ago. TurningPoint continues to offer innovative programs and state of the art, evidenced-based treatment including specialized physical therapy, massage therapy, counseling, nutrition and education for both patients and healthcare providers.

The Avon Foundation Comprehensive Breast Center at the **Georgia Cancer Center of Excellence at Grady Hospital** has been granted a full accreditation designation by the National Accreditation Program for Breast Centers (NAPBC), a program administered by the American College of Surgeons. According to the NAPBC, accreditation is granted only to those centers that have voluntarily committed to provide the highest level of breast care and undergo a rigorous evaluation and review of their performance. During the survey process, the center must demonstrate compliance with standards established by the NAPBC for treating women who are diagnosed with the full spectrum of breast disease.

The Black Women's Health Imperative (Imperative) announced today that it received a five-year, \$1.2 million award from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) to launch a new project to help decrease racial and ethnic disparities in breast and cervical cancer among Black women. The Imperative provided sub-grants to its community-based partners, including the **Center for Black Women's Wellness**.
